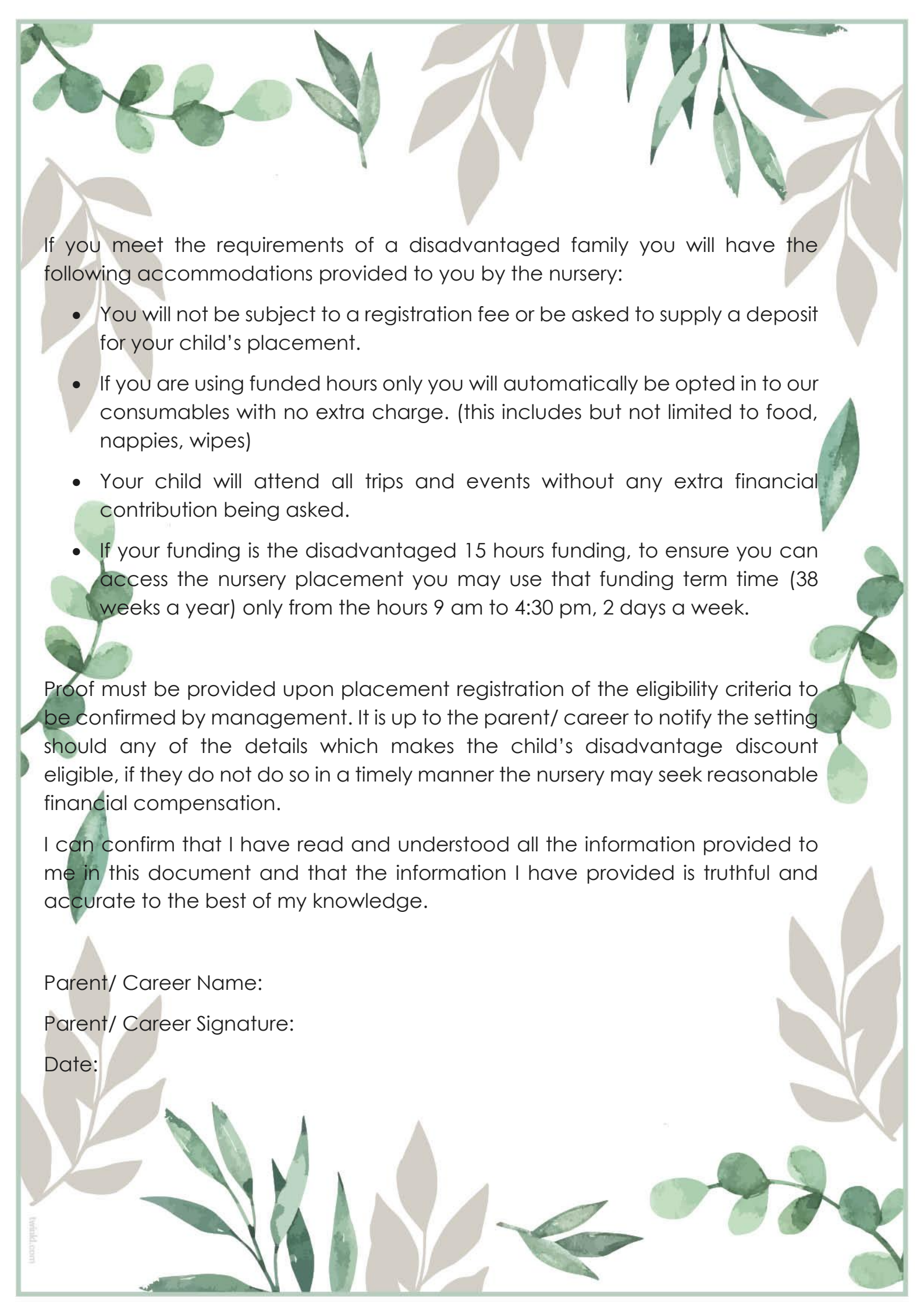


Disadvantaged family discounts at The Railway Children

The nursery uses the same criteria for the private based disadvantaged families discount as the government for allocating Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP). It is additional government funding given to early years childcare providers (such as nurseries, pre-schools, and childminders) to enhance the education, development, and learning of disadvantaged children aged 9 months to 4 years old. Children are eligible for EYPP if they receive at least one hour of free early years entitlements provision and their parent or carer receives one or more of the following benefits. If you believe you and your child are a disadvantaged family and would like to access the discounted full opt in options the nursery provides for consumables you must meet the following criteria:

Parents or careers must receive one or more.	Please sign in this box if you receive one of the following benefits. The nursery must see proof before your child starts.
Income Support	
Income-based Jobseekers allowance	
Income-related Employment and Support Allowance	
Support under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999	
The guaranteed element of Pension Credit	
Universal Credit, if the parent or carer's annual net household income is less than £7,400, not including any benefits	
If the child was formerly looked after by a local authority in England or Wales through adoption, a special guardianship order or a child arrangements order, they are also eligible.

If you meet the requirements of a disadvantaged family you will have the following accommodations provided to you by the nursery:

- You will not be subject to a registration fee or be asked to supply a deposit for your child's placement.
- If you are using funded hours only you will automatically be opted in to our consumables with no extra charge. (this includes but not limited to food, nappies, wipes)
- Your child will attend all trips and events without any extra financial contribution being asked.
- If your funding is the disadvantaged 15 hours funding, to ensure you can access the nursery placement you may use that funding term time (38 weeks a year) only from the hours 9 am to 4:30 pm, 2 days a week.

Proof must be provided upon placement registration of the eligibility criteria to be confirmed by management. It is up to the parent/ career to notify the setting should any of the details which makes the child's disadvantage discount eligible, if they do not do so in a timely manner the nursery may seek reasonable financial compensation.
